WELCOME

We welcome you to the Orthodox Church. Please feel at ease and free to participate in the singing. As a visitor you are welcome to come forward at the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy and venerate the Cross offered by the priest. Additionally you may receive the blessed bread (Antidoron) that is offered at that time. If you have questions or would like further information, the priest or one of the members of the parish will be pleased to help.

A WORD TO OUR VISITORS ON HOLY COMMUNION

The Orthodox Church does not practice open Communion. Therefore, only members of Canonical Orthodox Churches exercising jurisdiction in America may approach the Chalice for Holy Communion. The Orthodox do not regard Holy Communion solely as an act of personal piety, but also as an expression of union with the Orthodox Church's faith, doctrine, and discipline. Orthodox visitors wishing to receive Holy Communion should make their intention known to the priest in advance — ask any member of the parish for help in relaying your intention to the priest. Orthodox Christians should prepare themselves to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion through recent Confession, prayers of preparation for Holy Communion, and fasting (at minimum, from midnight before receiving).

PRIEST: (silently) O Master, Lord our God, who hast appointed in heaven ranks and hosts of angels and archangels for the service of Thy glory, make there to be with our entrance an entrance of holy angels, serving with us and glorifying Thy goodness. For to Thee belong all glory, honor, and worship, to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. Blessed is the entrance of Thy saints, always, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. (aloud) Wisdom. Let us attend.

PEOPLE: O Come, let us worship and fall down before Christ, O Son of God, ____.

- 1. (Sunday verse) who didst rise from the dead.
- 2. (Weekday verse) who art wondrous in Thy Saints.
- 3. (Feasts of the Theotokos) through the prayers of the Theotokos. Save us who sing unto Thee: Alleluia.

The appointed troparia and kontakia of the day are sung. (see facing and following page for Sunday troparia and kontakia in respective tone of the week).

SUNDAY TROPARIA

TONE 1

When the stone had been sealed by the Jews; while the soldiers were guarding Thy most pure body; Thou didst rise on the third day, O Savior, granting life to the world. The powers of heaven therefore cried to Thee, O Giver of life: Glory to Thy resurrection, O Christ. Glory to Thy Kingdom. Glory to Thy dispensation, O Thou who lovest mankind.

Tone 2

When Thou didst descend to death, O Life immortal, Thou didst slay hell with the splendor of Thy Godhead. And when from the depths Thou didst raise the dead, all the powers of heaven cried out: O Giver of life, Christ our God, Glory to Thee.

TONE 3

Let the heavens rejoice. Let the earth be glad. For the Lord has shown strength with His arm. He has trampled down death by death. He has become the first-born of the dead. He has delivered us from the depths of hell and has granted the world great mercy.

TONE 4

When the women disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the joyous message of Thy resurrection; they cast away the ancestral curse and elatedly told the apostles: Death is overthrown. Christ God is risen, granting the world great mercy.

TONE 5

Let us, the faithful, praise and worship the Word, co-eternal with the Father and the Spirit, born for our salvation from the Virgin; for He willed to be lifted up on the cross in the flesh, to endure death, and to raise the dead by his glorious resurrection.

TONE 6

The angelic powers were at Thy tomb; the guards became as dead men. Mary stood by Thy grave, seeking Thy most pure body. Thou didst capture hell, not being tempted by it. Thou didst come to the Virgin, granting life. O Lord who didst rise from the dead: glory to Thee.

Tone 7

By Thy cross, Thou didst destroy death. To the thief, Thou didst open paradise. For the myrrh-bearers, Thou didst change weeping into joy. And Thou didst command Thy disciples, O Christ God, to proclaim that Thou art risen, granting the world great mercy.

TONE 8

Thou didst descend from on high, O Merciful One. Thou didst endure the three-day burial to free us from our sufferings. O Lord, our Life and resurrection: glory to Thee.

SUNDAY KONTAKIA

TONE 1

As God, Thou didst rise from the tomb in glory, raising the world with Thyself. Human nature praises Thee as God, for death has vanished. Adam exults, O Master. Eve rejoices for she is freed from bondage and cries to Thee: Thou art the

Giver of resurrection to all, O Christ.

Tone 2

Hell became afraid, O Almighty Savior, seeing the miracle of Thy resurrection from the tomb. The dead arose. Creation, with Adam, beheld this and rejoiced with Thee. And the world, O my Savior, praises Thee forever.

TONE 3

On this day Thou didst rise from the tomb, O Merciful One, leading us from the gates of death. On this day Adam exults as Eve rejoices. With the prophets and patriarchs they unceasingly praise the divine majesty of Thy power.

TONE 4

My Savior and Redeemer as God rose from the tomb and delivered the earthborn from their chains. He has shattered the gates of hell, and as Master, He has risen on the third day.

TONE 5

Thou didst descend into hell, O my Savior, shattering its gates as Almighty; resurrecting the dead as Creator; and destroying the sting of death. Thou hast delivered Adam from the curse, O Lover of Man, and we cry to Thee: O Lord, save us.

Tone 6

When Christ God, the Giver of life, raised all the dead from the valleys of misery with His mighty hand, He bestowed resurrection on the human race. He is the Savior of all, the Resurrection, the Life and the God of all.

TONE 7

The dominion of death can no longer hold men captive, for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its powers. Hell is bound, while the prophets rejoice and cry: The Savior has come to those in faith. Enter, you faithful, into the resurrection.

TONE 8

By rising from the tomb, Thou didst raise the dead and resurrect Adam. Eve exults in Thy resurrection, and the world celebrates Thy rising from the dead, O greatly Merciful One.

At the conclusion of the entrance hymns the following Theotokion is often sung.

Steadfast Protectress of Christians, constant advocate before the Creator, O despise not the cry of us sinners, but in thy goodness come speedily to help us who call on thee in faith, hasten to hear our petition and to intercede for us, O Theotokos, for thou dost ever protect those who honor thee.

THE TRISAGION

PRIEST: (silently) O Holy God, who restest in Thy Saints, who art hymned by the Seraphim with thrice-holy voice, and art glorified by the Cherubim, and worshiped by all the heavenly Powers, who from non-being hast brought all things into being, who hast created man after Thine image and likeness, and hast adorned him with Thine every gift, who givest to him that asketh wisdom and understanding, who despiseth not him that sinneth, but hast set forth repentance unto salvation, who hast vouchsafed us, Thy humble and unworthy servants, even in this hour to stand before the glory of Thy holy Altar, and to offer Thee due worship and glorification, Thyself, O Master, accept even from the mouths of us sinners the thrice-holy hymn, and visit us in Thy loving-kindness. Pardon us every offense, voluntary and involuntary, sanctify our souls and bodies, and grant us to serve Thee in holiness all the days of our life, through the intercessions of the holy Theotokos, and of all the Saints, who from everlasting have been well-pleasing to Thee.

(aloud) For holy art Thou, O our God, and unto Thee do we send up glory, to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages.

PEOPLE: Amen.

PRIEST: (silently) Make shine in our hearts, O Master who lovest man, the incorruptible light of Thy divine knowledge, and open the eyes of our mind to the comprehension of the preaching of Thy Gospel. Instill in us also the fear of Thy blessed commandments that, trampling down all carnal desires, we may pursue a spiritual way of life, both considering and doing all things well-pleasing unto Thee. For Thou art the enlightenment of our souls and bodies, O Christ God, and unto Thee do we send up glory, together with Thy Father, who is without beginning, and Thine allholy, and good, and life-creating Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

(aloud) Wisdom. Attend. Let us hear the holy Gospel. Peace be to all.

PEOPLE: And to Thy spirit.

PRIEST: The reading from the Holy Gospel according to ____.

PEOPLE: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

TONE 1

PRIEST: Again we pray for our Most Blessed Metropolitan____ for our Right Reverend Bishop____, and for all our brethren in Christ.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy. (3 times)

(The Priest says The Prayer of Fervent Supplication silently)

O Lord our God, accept this fervent supplication from Thy servants, and have mercy on us according to the multitude of Thy mercies, and send down Thy compassion upon us and upon all Thy people, who await from Thee a great and rich mercy.

PRIEST: Again we pray for the blessed and ever-memorable most holy Orthodox Patriarchs, the founders of this holy church and for all our fathers and brethren, the Orthodox gone to rest before us, who lie here and everywhere.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy. (3 times)

PRIEST: Again we pray for mercy, life, peace, health, salvation, visitation, pardon and forgiveness of the sins of the servants of God, and of our brethren of this holy temple.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy. (3 times)

PRIEST: Again we pray for those who bear fruit and do good works in this holy and revered temple, for those who labor and those who sing, and for all the people present, who await of Thee great and rich mercy.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy. (3 times)

PRIEST: For Thou art a merciful God who lovest man, and unto Thee do we send up glory, to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

PEOPLE: Amen.

PRIEST: That He may instruct them in the Word of truth.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

PRIEST: That He may reveal to them the Gospel of righteousness.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

PRIEST: That He may unite them unto His Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

PRIEST: Save them, have mercy on them, help them, and keep them, O God, by Thy grace.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

PRIEST: Bow your heads unto the Lord, ye catechumens.

PEOPLE: To Thee, O Lord.

PRIEST: (silently) O Lord, our God, who dwellest on high and lookest upon the humble, who has sent forth as the salvation of the race of men Thine only-begotten Son, and God, our Lord Jesus Christ, look upon Thy servants the catechumens, who have bowed their necks before Thee. PRIEST: As many as are catechumens, depart. Catechumens depart. As many as are catechumens, depart. Let no catechumen remain. As many as are the faithful, again and again in peace, let us pray unto the Lord.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

PRIEST: Help us, save us, have mercy on us and keep us, O God, by Thy grace.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

PRIEST: (silently) We give thanks unto Thee, O Lord of Powers, who hast vouchsafed unto us even now to stand before Thy holy Altar, and to fall down before Thy compassion for our sins and for the ignorance of the people. Accept, O God, our supplications, make us worthy to offer unto Thee supplications and prayers and bloodless sacrifices for all Thy people. Extra petitions are added if a deacon is serving.

PRIEST: Help us, save us, have mercy on us, and keep us O God, by Thy grace.

PEOPLE: Lord, have mercy.

PRIEST: (silently) With these blessed Powers, we also, O Master, Lover of man, cry and say, Holy art Thou and all-holy, Thou and Thine only-begotten Son and Thy Holy Spirit; Holy art Thou and all-holy, and magnificent is Thy glory who has so loved the world as to give Thine only-begotten Son that all that believe in Him should not perish but have eternal life, Who when He had come and had fulfilled all the dispensation for us, in the night in which He was given up, or rather gave Himself up, for the life of the world, took bread in His holy and immaculate and blameless hands, and when He had given thanks, and blessed it, and hallowed it, and broken it, He gave it to His holy disciples and apostles, saying:

(aloud) Take, eat, this is my body, which is broken for you, for the forgiveness of sins.

PEOPLE: Amen.

PRIEST: (silently) And likewise, the cup after supper, saying:

Of Thy Mystical Supper, O Son of God, accept me today as a communicant; for I will not speak of Thy Mystery to thine enemies, neither like Judas will I give Thee a kiss; but like the thief will I confess Thee: Remember me, O Lord, in Thy Kingdom.

May the communion of Thy Holy Mysteries be neither to my judgment, nor to my condemnation, O Lord, but to the healing of soul and body. Amen.

The priest comes forward and communicates those Orthodox Christians who are prepared to receive the Mystery, saying to each person:

The Precious and Holy Body and Blood, of our Lord and God and Saviour, Jesus Christ, is given to the servant(handmaid) of God _____, for the remission of their sins and unto life everlasting.

During the communion of the people, the following hymn is sung:

(The final verse concludes with:)

The Priest quietly prays,

Having beheld the Resurrection of Christ, let us worship the holy Lord Jesus, the only Sinless One. Come all ye faithful, let us venerate Christ's holy Resurrection. For behold through the Cross joy hath come into all the world. Shine, shine, O New Jerusalem. The glory of the Lord hath shone on Thee, Exalt now and be glad O Sion. Be radiant, O pure Theotokos, in the Resurrection of thy Son.

PRIEST: (silently) Blessed is our God.

(aloud) Always, now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

PEOPLE: Amen. Let our mouths be filled with Thy praise, O Lord, that we may sing of Thy glory, for Thou hast made us worthy to partake of Thy holy, divine, immortal, and life-creating Mysteries. Keep us in Thy holiness, that all the day we may meditate upon Thy righteousness. Alleluia. Alleluia. Alleluia.



- That thou givest them they gather: thou openest thine hand, they are filled with good.
- Thou hidest thy face, they are troubled: thou takest away their breath, they die, and return to their dust.

- The glory of the LORD shall endure for ever: the LORD shall rejoice in his works.
- He looketh on the earth, and it trembleth: he toucheth the hills, and they smoke.
